Axiom Care's Residential Community Behavior Modification (RCBM) Program at the Del Sol campus provides structured, evidence-based treatment and supportive services for justice-involved individuals, focusing on accountability, behavior change, and successful community reintegration.



Set For Success Program



Pre-Release Engagement

30-60 Days Prior to Release

- Screening & Evaluation
- Review SFS program rules and expectations
- Identify post-release support services
- Address SDOH (housing, ID, insurance, work, transportation).



Release Day

Day of Release

- Parole intake
- Axiom Housing intake
- Immediate care coordination initiated



Initial Outpatient Phase

First 7-10 Days

- Psych evaluation & primary care visit
- ASAM assessment & level of care assignment
- Assigned Axiom Care Team
- Basic needs addressed (AHCCCS, ID, SS card)



Intensive Outpatient & Stabilization

Phased Progression

- Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOP)
- 1:1 counseling, ART, case management
- Workforce development & employment
- Increased independence over time



Program Completion & Care Coordination

- Completion of treatment phases
- Increased independence
- Employment & community stability
- Coordination with Health Home
- Ongoing support connections



Outpatient Services – Mofford Center



Axiom Care's integrated clinic at 3742 N. 3rd Street in Phoenix (Mofford Center) provides group and individual substance use treatment, outpatient behavioral health services, peer support, case management and workforce development.
